#### **Approval of Minutes**

#### **Business Services,** Colleen Rockafellow

#### **Human Resources, Joe Klinger**

- An email was sent to full-time employees about completing mandatory annual Sexual Harassment training.
- Medicare Part D notices will be mailed out to all employees (required by law). No action needed.
   Medicare eligible employees will find information on prescription drug coverage as well as upcoming enrollment period.
- Currently working on creating a new and updated hard copy of the full-time staff directory, which will be out by November 1.
- The Health Insurance Committee met and discussed claim history and how plans have progressed over the past 12 months. The committee will begin the process of discussing employee contributions for the 2025 calendar year. Another meeting will take place later this month.
- New hires: Director of Child Development Center, CRM Coordinator, and Manager of Records.
- Few vacancies at this time. They include: Coordinator of Degree Audit, Grants Specialists, Full-time Faculty, and Director of Curriculum & Assessment.

#### **Information Technology,** *Mike Garrity*

- The new refund schedule moving forward for Spring 2025. The new refund schedule will allow students 7 calendar days to drop with a full refund.
- The timeline for the new CMS website has been moved up. The project will begin at the start of the 2025 calendar year with a completion deadline by the end of the year.
- Colleague self-service: working on making the withdrawal procedure easier for faculty and students. Looking for a way to automate the process to auto-populate the grades or a potential different screen that will allow faculty to go straight to a drop.
- Financial Value Transparency and Gainful Employment requires the college to submit reports on completion rates and costs so prospective and current students have a clear picture of programs and their costs. National Student Clearing House is offering a partnership to submit files on the college's behalf, due on January 15, 2025. IT is collaborating with Financial Aid to build out the process in Colleague to get the data to NSCH.



- CRM Recruit enhancements: ICCB requires the college to add a Middle Eastern/North African
  category to application forms. Other requests are to build a registration form for Cook County
  Sheriff and importing Accuplacer scores into Recruit.
- New Photo ID platform software has been updated to a new version and SQL data migrated to new SQL server. Currently working with the new platform to potentially provide an optional digital ID in addition to printed ID.
- Over 30,000 instructional emails were sent to student email accounts regarding phishing scams and summarizing what they need to look out for.




