

Are you a neurodivergent individual who is looking to increase their employment skills and gain some real-world, hands-on experience?

S.E.E.D. provides students the opportunity to earn a certificate through in-person instruction and employment experiences that are designed to enhance employability skills, preparing them for independent employment in the community.

Students receive classroom instruction to increase the following skills related to the workplace setting:

- Applying for a job.
- Career exploration.
- Getting a job.
- Interpersonal skills.
- Job search.

- Keeping a job.
- Knowing your rights.
- Self-advocacy.
- Social relationships at work.
- Work ethic.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

After completing instruction, students will engage in a 175-hour (10-15 hours/week) internship to apply the skills they have been developing. Students may complete their experience using on-campus and community sites which will be arranged in partnership with S.E.E.D Program staff. Student will continue meeting with S.E.E.D. Program staff for coaching during the internship.

Upon successful completion of all required parts, students will receive the S.E.E.D. (Skill Enhancement and Employee Development) Certificate through the Center for Access and Accommodative Services (CAAS) and the School of Continuing Education. A graduation ceremony is held in May after program completion to award the students their certificates.

Program Cost

Cost of the program is **\$499** and due at the time of enrollment. Financial aid cannot be used to cover the tuition for the S.E.E.D. Program as it is not a credit-bearing program.
