

#### **VOLUNTEERS WANTED AT TRITON COLLEGE**

We are still seeking volunteers for our Conversational English Tutoring Program (CETP). This program pairs volunteers with students from the ESL program at Triton College, enabling them to practice English through regular conversations. We especially need volunteers available in the late afternoon and/or early evening. Please contact Beth for more details.



#### **TIMESHEETS**

PLEASE, PLEASE, don't forget to submit your monthly timesheets to us. Many of you serve in your community but forget to report it to us. These hours are critical, especially in today's political climate where the President is trying to eliminate AmeriCorps. Your time, no matter how many or few hours you contribute, shows the impact our program has in the community. We need to show elected

officials all the good work that you do. Timesheets are due by the 5th of each month.

**Keep in mind**—We can accept late timesheets up to three months after the deadline. HOWEVER, for those requesting mileage reimbursement, we can only process mileage payments for <u>two months</u> past. For example, if you submit your January timesheet by March 5th, you'll be eligible to receive January's mileage reimbursement. However, if we don't get your January timesheet until after March 5th, you're unable to get reimbursed for that month.



#### ANNUAL VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION LUNCHEON

Over the past few years, the RSVP has held its annual volunteer recognition luncheon in November. However, I decided to switch things up, and we will move this event to the end of April to align with National Volunteer Appreciation Month. 
#### CALLING ALL YOLUNTEERS.

### **Pop Tabs for Ronald McDonald House Charities**

RSVP is partnering with Ronald McDonald House Charities of Chicagoland to collect pop tabs!

<u>How it works:</u> United Scrap Metal purchases the tabs at market rates and adds an extra donation to support families staying close to their hospitalized child. On average, 40–55 cents per pound goes directly to helping families.

<u>Our Goal:</u> We're aiming to collect 10 lbs. (about 12,670 pop tabs!) by December to donate to the Ronald McDonald House in Hines, IL.


