President's Update



Triton College has been named one of 200 institutions eligible to compete for the \$1 million Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence, the nation's premier recognition of achievement and performance among two-year colleges. Eligibility was based on student outcomes data, including retention, completion, transfer, and bachelor's degree attainment rates.

President Moore stated that this milestone reflects Triton's commitment to its mission and values. "This recognition highlights years of intentional, college-wide efforts to improve access, completion, transfer, and workforce outcomes for every student," she said.

Awarded every two years, the Aspen Prize recognizes the nation's top-performing community colleges that demonstrate outstanding student success and continuous improvement.

Faculty and Student Achievements

The Triton College Ethics Bowl team placed 7th in the regional Ethics Bowl competition held last weekend, outperforming several four-year institutions, including the University of Chicago. The Intercollegiate Ethics Bowl is a nationwide academic competition, run by the Association for Practical and Professional Ethics (APPE), where teams analyze and discuss complex ethical issues.

The Triton College Computing Society participated in the U.S. Department of Energy's national CyberForce cybersecurity competition, competing against more than 80 colleges and universities across the country. Triton delivered an outstanding performance, outscoring major institutions such as the University of Illinois Chicago (UIC) and DePaul University.
